A PLACE TO CALL HOME



As individuals, **Alex** and **Juan Pablo** faced their own challenges on their path to finding safe and affordable housing. Several years ago, Alex dealt with the loss of his partner, and underwent spinal surgery, which affected his mobility and ability to accomplish simple tasks such as cleaning or eating dinner. Juan Pablo was twice diagnosed with cancer and has been in remission for almost ten years.

Through these challenges, both men were welcomed into **Catholic Charities Peter Claver Community** and a new friendship was born. They have formed new bonds with other residents and the staff and are active participants in the program’s activities, including weekly bingo. Alex can always depend on the staff for help with light dusting, delivering meals to his unit, and checking in on his well-being. Through monetary donations, Alex has even gained access to critical medical

replacement items. Juan Pablo has experienced relief, as well, through crucial services and assistance on the various community projects he is dedicated to.

Leaving the uncertainty of unstable housing behind, Alex and Juan Pablo found new freedom as they settled into Peter Claver Community. Alex is now able to spend more time with **Rusty V**, his beautiful golden retriever who knows more than 60 tricks and commands, and to continue his human advocacy working with seniors and the disabled. Juan Pablo, a progressive artist, is now able to pursue his creative talent without worrying about where he will sleep for the night.

Both men are proud of Peter Claver Community residents who are active in the community. Juan Pablo points out that some residents “give back and help as they have been helped,” while Alex praises the staff as “tremendous help both physically and mentally...a top notch group of wonderful and caring people who actually extend themselves to help others.” Juan Pablo recently donated his time and talents constructing a dog house painted with self-made Caribbean colors which he donated to PAWS, a non-profit that provides needed companion animal services to hundreds of low-income San Franciscans. He also is a youth mentor and directs San Francisco’s Mission District annual Dia de los Muertos Procession.

Alex and Juan Pablo are examples of how independence, creativity and involvement are born out of knowing that they belong to a community. The dignity, compassion, and hope afforded to all of our neighbors—youth, seniors, homeless, single parents, and more—is the very groundwork of nurturing individuals to a life of self-sufficiency. ■

Volunteer Profile **PATRONA**

As you enter **Catholic Charities Leland House**, you are immediately greeted with smiles and friendly faces. The home, situated in one of the few neighborhoods in San Francisco currently untouched by gentrification and rising costs in housing, is a safe haven for those living with HIV/AIDS in frail and ailing health. A welcoming atmosphere, then, is of importance. It is no wonder the home is run by caring staff and volunteers who seek to continue the familial community. Of these individuals, one volunteer stands out for her altruistic outlook on life and the people she serves.

Patrona moved from a small town in southern Illinois to San Francisco 26 years ago, seeking a new adventure. What she found was a community she would devote herself to for 15 years. "Growing up I was blessed to have parents who were able to care for us. I've realized that others may not have had that same experience," she reminisces with a humble smile.

When asked why she continues to volunteer at Leland House, she contemplates, "The people—after hearing their stories. I try to be conscious and think about what made them who they are. I've never been near homeless, near hungry; so I can't imagine what it's like to have gone through that and to still be here."

San Francisco is constantly evolving and the loss of social community has impacted the most vulnerable. Catholic Charities Leland House stands as a reminder that there is still hope. There are those that care about the well-being of others who, like Patrona, devote their time to serving the less fortunate.

Even while celebrating her 15th anniversary as a volunteer, Patrona tirelessly and with a huge smile worked in the kitchen to prepare a delicious feast for everyone at Leland House. One can understand her significance in the house as every few minutes a resident will chat with her and thank her for her service. ■
