BACKGROUND

CYO Camp was started in 1946 with 12 acres on Salmon Creek near Occidental, California under the vision and leadership of Fr. John V. Silva. Fr. Silva named it Camp Don Bosco who was a 19th century priest who dedicated his life to disadvantaged urban youth.

In 1955 Camp was renamed Our Lady of the Redwoods (OLR). Rev. Eugene A. Gallagher had been appointed Archdiocesan Director of CYO, and improvements to the Camp became a major CYO project. Under the leadership of Fr. Peter G. Armstrong, Camp grew to over 200 acres with major development of the property as well as new and enhanced programs.

CYO Camp flourished in the 1970's-1980's. The Summer Camp programs grew to over 2500 campers. With the addition of the Caritas Creek program at CYO Camp in 1985, a new business was born under the leadership of Paula Pardini, making CYO Camp open year-round. Camp now included the three businesses of Summer Camp, Outdoor Education and Caritas Creek, and the Retreat Center.

2006-2010 were critical years at CYO Camp. Camp was going through many changes, which included the Caritas Creek Program being separated from Catholic Charities CYO in 2007. This reduced attendance numbers to a few hundred and threatened the viability of the future of CYO Camp. Camp was operating in the red, due to dwindling numbers in all of its programs, losing over \$900,000 a year.

Over many years, the original OLR side of Camp, formerly known as Girls Camp and presently known as Miwok, became less usable as many of the buildings were in severe disrepair. The Catholic Charities (CC) Board of Directors gave Camp three years to correct these issues, and if not, they would have to consider closing CYO Camp.

Catholic Charities (CC) Board of Directors began negotiations with Caritas Creek and Catholic Charities CYO, and in 2010 the Caritas Creek program returned to CYO Camp. Camp began to grow and became financially viable again. Lou Reynaud had the brainchild to create a Camp alumni group to reconnect alumni and help ensure the future viability and sustainability of Camp. In 2010 he recruited Caren Normandin and a small team to spearhead the effort and the CYO Camp Alumni Group was born.

The CYO Camp Alumni Group is launched and starts to make a difference. The Advisory Board is established to focus on Summer Camp. The Board visits and evaluates Camp over the summer and creates a report with recommendations.



Alumni Have a Voice at Catholic Charities, and Honoring Alumni Who Have Passed

After nine years of being 100% volunteers, CC approves a part-time position, reporting to Camp Director, Rick Garcia. Caren Normandin is the first alum to be hired and responsible for the Alumni program.

Installation of a state-of-the-art water system begins. The water system at Camp was outdated and at risk of breaking to the point of threatening Camp's entire water use. Catholic Charities began investing \$2M to install a new system to support all water needs of Camp.



QUICKSILVER, AKA (REEKSIDE, AKA STEPPING STONE needs YOU!

The old row of cabins were dismantled after over 40 years of use. The original cabins (pre-wood cabins) were tent cabins... and we are going to return to our roots. Also, the County requires that permanent structures have to be set-back from the creek and therefore cabins can only be used May-September.

Our goal is to rebuild this area of Camp, which will include building new platforms, purchasing tent cabins (16'x16'), bunkbeds and mattresses, plus a storage container for use during the winter months
