About

In partnership with Marin County Department of Health & Human Services (Marin HHS) received County Medical Services Program (CMSP) County Local Indigent Care Needs grant funding to support efforts to end chronic homelessness in Marin County through Housing Case Management.

Catholic Charities goals are to provide clients navigation support into and ongoing support in permanent supportive housing and improve the wellbeing of Marin's population who are experiencing chronic homelessness or precariously housed.

The services in this scope of work serve as a critical element of the County's implementation of a unified coordinated entry and care management system by standardizing screening, assessments, and care coordination; and by promoting bi-directional information sharing and care coordination among providers. The goal for this systems-level change is coordinated, and sustainable approaches that will improve the health and decrease the cost of caring for high-risk, high-cost individuals.

The vision is to build a sustainable, evidence-based, outcomes-focused coordinated system of care across sectors to more efficiently and effectively serve Marin County's most vulnerable residents.
