About

Catholic Charities San Francisco Boys' Home is a Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) that provides residential mental health treatment and community and school-based services to adjudicated and pre-adjudicated youth ages 13–18, most of whom are transitioning from a juvenile hall setting. A combination of therapeutic, educational, rehabilitation, and recreational programs address the multiple and diverse needs of each child. The youth live in a San Francisco residence, staffed 24 hours a day.

The Catholic Charities San Francisco Boys' Home serves as a diversion program for at risk and in-risk youth of San Francisco encouraging healthy habits and relationships and productive re-entry into society. The program focuses on achieving personal stability for each client and working on restoring a healthy and successful relationship between the client, their family, and the community.

Services

- Short-term, community-based program offering a home-living environment
- Activities geared toward increasing self-sufficiency and self-esteem
- Counseling and mentorship programs
- Work/study tutorials and vocational activities
- Family and individual therapy
- Individualized case management
